The City Council of the City of Camanche, Iowa met in regular session September 16, 2014 at 6:00 P.M. at Camanche City Hall. Present on roll call: Mayor Fahlbeck, presiding, and the following named council members: Willis, McManus, Lind, Varner, and Wruck. Also present were City Administrator Roth, City Attorney Lonergan, City Engineer Solchenberger, and department heads Houzenga, Schutte, and Jindrich.

A moment of silence was observed. Mayor Fahlbeck led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Moved by McManus, second by Wruck to approve the agenda. On roll call – all ayes.

Approve City Clerk/Treasurer's Report for August 2014 with the following receipts: General Fund - \$121,869.36, Library - \$10,730.62, Parks - \$8,292.42, Cemetery - \$2,800.00, Road Use - \$50,457.67, Employee Benefit - \$44.53, Police & Fire Pension - \$141.02, Perp Care - \$200.00, Debt Service - \$134.12, Washington Blvd Project - \$3.73, Water Utility Fund - \$3,026.52, Sewer Utility Fund - \$3,655.35, Landfill/Garbage - \$1,894.39 for a total of \$203,249.73; receive, accept and place on file Police Dept. monthly report for August 2014; receive, accept and place on file the Historical Board meeting minutes held Sept. 4, 2014, Rose Hill meeting held Sept. 8, 2014; approval annual Urban Renewal Report; accept Civil Service Certified list for Police Officer Position; set Friday, October 31, 2014 from 6-8 P.M. as Trick-or-Treat. On roll call – all ayes.

Goal Setting – Pat Callahan will be conducting the goal setting session Tuesday, October 28 starting at 5:00. We will have pizza brought in.

Public Works Director Position – 4 applications/resumes have been received. They are due at 4:00 P.M., September 26, 2014. Roth was wondering how the council wants to proceed. By the ordinance, the Mayor recommends and the council approves. Roth and Fahlbeck will look over the applications first.

Employee Contract Negotiations – Fahlbeck would like to separate the contracts and negotiate the departments separately. Lonergan stated that most city administrators participate in negotiations. Roth did not want to participate because a citizen says it is not ethical. Lonergan informed the council of the history of negotiations and he felt Roth should participate. Lonergan's request was that the matter be put on the agenda so all employees know how the council is going to proceed.

Great River Road Month – Edith Pfeiffer had stopped down and dropped a proclamation to be read declaring September Great River Road Month. A study was made and it revealed that it would be great to have the Great River Road Route pass through town and not bypass the city on Hwy. 67. Fahlbeck read the Proclamation.

Engineer's Report – Solchenberger wanted to make sure he was clear on the changes to the Washington Blvd. Enhancement Project. The savings would be \$8,150 with some of the trees eliminated. He stated that using stamped concrete is more than the pavers. There would b e a \$6,347 savings to use all concrete. Willis was wondering if it is work the savings. He would like it to look nice.

Moved by Lind, second by Wruck to use concrete in the sitting areas. On roll call – ayes – Wruck, McManus, and Lind. Nays – Varner, Willis.

Solchenberger reported that Mediacom is moving the lines in order to get the trees cut down along 2nd Avenue. The project should start next week.

Fahlbeck asked him about the drainage issues by the driveway on 9th Avenue. Dan has talked to Todd and Determann is going to take a grinder and grind the curb. See if this solves the problem. There was no problem with it last year. The final payment has not been paid yet.

Moved by Lind, second by Wruck to approve the changing of Great River Road Route. On roll call – all ayes.

Fahlbeck wanted to thank Public Works for their upkeep of the bike path. He would also like to publicly thank Mr. and Mr. Jerry Wiebers, Mr. and Mrs. Al Crider, and Mr. and Mrs. Tom Murphy for picking up litter along the bike path and the bypass.

In regards to the grass mowing complaint, Wruck was wondering if the door could be tagged on a Thursday and then they have until Monday to cut it. Mark Hilgendorf explained that most of the properties they mow are vacant houses.

Lind was wondering where we are on the sale of the city hall property. Roth stated that Lonergan contacted Steve Howes to do a market analysis. Roth has forwarded some info to him and he hasn't heard back yet. When the city was working on the budget, he though the city engineer was only going to come to one meeting a month. That hasn't happened yet. He was told that right now there are projects going on and he needs to report on issues.

Schutte was glad to have been given the opportunity to tour the American Queen this afternoon. Concerning the sale of the present city hall, he would like to keep the equipment here. He stated the council wanted to save money and eliminate a building but there still needs to be a building for the equipment. He feels they are being forced out. Fahlbeck stated the reserve money could be used. Schutte said that money is reserved for equipment. Fahlbeck said, "It will all work out."

Hilgendorf reported that the weight limit signs were put up. Roth stated that letters were sent out to the businesses in that area.

Paul Willis commented that since the Scenic Byway will be going through Camanche, he would like to see signs pointing to the river.

At 6:59 P.M., being no further business, the Mayor declared the meeting to be adjourned.

At 7:13 - Work Session - Review of qualifications of consulting engineering firms.

Roth reported that he had contacted 8 engineering firms in the area.

Wruck was wondering if there would be cost savings to hire an engineer as a public works director. He feels it would be a good idea to have Tom and a couple of council members to look over the materials received instead of each council member looking at them individually.

Roth was wondering why does the council want to go ahead and change engineering firms. Everyone makes mistakes. He doesn't think anyone is unhappy.

Lind stated he has heard some complaints from citizens about the engineering firm we have. Kenny says he has not been happy with all the changeovers, i.e. the bridge project.

Roth commented on the fact that Shive has been the engineer for 30+ years. Wruck stated longevity isn't always the best.

Lonergan made the comment that with the public works director retiring and if Shive does away, a lot of knowledge will be lost.

Fahlbeck put Varner and Willis on a committee with Roth to review the qualifications.

Dan told the council that if they have any problems with anything, please let him or Tom know.

The work session ended at 7:45 P.M.
