September 5, 2017

The City Council of the City of Camanche, Iowa met in regular session September 5, 2017 at 6:00 P.M. at Camanche City Hall. Present on roll call: Mayor Pro-tem Paul Varner, presiding in the absence of the Mayor, and the following named council members: Metzger, Saxon, Lind and Wruck. Also present were City Attorneys John Frey and Randy Current, City Administrator Andrew Kida, department heads Schutte, Reid and Jindrich.

A moment of silent prayer was observed. Jay Saxon led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Moved by Metzger, second by Varner to approve the agenda. On roll call – all ayes.

Kida read the Proclamation for Drive the Great River Road Month.

Receive, accept and place on file minutes from Rose Hill Cemetery meeting held August 14, Board of Adjustment meeting held August 22, Historical Board meeting held July 6; and approve Susie Vogel's appointment to Park and Recreation Commission, term ending July 2019. On roll call – all ayes.

Second reading of an Ordinance Amending Chapter 3-3-29 of the Camanche Code of Ordinances by Adding a New Section 37, Establishing No Overnight Parking in Public Park Lots.

Wruck was wondering if the signs were here. Can it be enforced if the signs aren't installed? The signs can't be ordered or installed until the ordinance is adopted.

Moved by Saxon, second by Lind to approve the second reading an Ordinance Amending Chapter 3-3-29 of the Camanche Code of Ordinances by Adding a New Section 37, Establishing No Overnight Parking in Public Park Lots. On roll call – ayes – Varner, Wruck, Metzger, Saxon and Lind.

Moved by Metzger, second by Saxon to waive the third reading an Ordinance Amending Chapter 3-3-29 of the Camanche Code of Ordinances by Adding a New Section 37, Establishing No Overnight Parking in Public Park Lots. On roll call – ayes – Wruck, Metzger, Saxon, Lind and Varner.

Moved by Lind, second by Varner to Adopt Ordinance No. 747 - an Ordinance Amending Chapter 3-3-29 of the Camanche Code of Ordinances by Adding a New Section 37, Establishing No Overnight Parking in Public Park Lots. On roll call – ayes – Metzger, Saxon, Lind, Varner, and Wruck.

The July 2017 Fire Department Report was read.

First reading of an Ordinance Amending Chapter 2-8-1 of the Camanche, Iowa Code of Ordinances by Redefining Attendance Requirements and Procedures.

Moved by Metzger, second by Saxon to approve the first reading of an Ordinance Amending Chapter 2-8-1 of the Camanche, Iowa Code of Ordinances by Redefining Attendance Requirements and Procedures. On roll call – ayes – Saxon, Lind, Varner, Wruck and Metzger.

Moved by Saxon, second by Lind to approve a Resolution Approving the City Street Financial Report. On roll call – all ayes.

The budget needs to be amended due to the 21st Street Culvert project.

Moved by Varner, second by Saxon to approve a Resolution Setting the Time and Place for a Public Hearing on a Proposal to Amend the FYE 2018 Budget. On roll call – all ayes.

Moved by Lind, second by Metzger to approve a Resolution of the City Council Establishing Fees for Burials at Rose Hill Cemetery. On roll call – all ayes.

Moved by Metzger, second by Varner to approve a Resolution Approving Requirements for Refuse Collection for Residences in the City of Camanche. On roll call – all ayes.

Demolition of Garner Hall – we need to get RFPs for the asbestos removal and deconstruction.

City Administrator Report – everyone got a brochure welcoming board members. He would like to use this as template for all of the boards and commissions. He will have the drug policy ready to be adopted at the September 19 meeting. September 12, 2017 at 11:00 will be the ground breaking for Park Vista.

He informed the council that a committee of the mayor, Jay Saxon, the Public Works Direction, Sheryl Jindrich and himself will be conducting the next set of interviews for the City Clerk/Treasurer position. If the council would like to submit questions for the interviews, please submit them to him. He explained the interview process. Jindrich stated there are 5 excellent candidates. She feels confident that anyone of them could do a good job.

Wruck would like put on the next agenda discussion on calendar parking. He would also like to see the approval of golf cart stickers. That would bring in extra revenue.

Metzger wanted to thank the council for addressing the garbage issues. What is the stance on grass in the street? On the City of Camanche Contact Information list, she would like the council members' personal addresses removed from the list. She would also like everyone to keep the family of Sheila Dodd in their thoughts and prayers after she lost her battle with cancer.

There is a new sign at Central Park.

Jindrich told everyone that election nomination papers are due to City Hall by 5:00 P.M. on Thursday, September 21.

Metzger wanted to also remind everyone that the annual Suicide Walk will be September 17 starting at Imperial Lanes.

Eddie Stearns thinks that people should have to attend the council meeting if they apply for golf cart permits.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:49 P.M.
