March 3, 2020

The City Council of the City of Camanche, Iowa met in regular session March 3, 2020 at 6:00 p.m. at Camanche City Hall. Present on roll call: Mayor Trevor Willis, presiding, and council members Varner, Schnoor, Weller and Brightman. Absent: Bowman. Also present were City Attorneys Randy Current and Brayden Roberts and Department Heads Reid, Alderman for Hilgendorf, Schutte and Schneider.

A moment of silent prayer was observed. Mayor Willis led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Moved by Varner, second by Weller to approve the Agenda. On roll call – all Ayes.

Mayor Willis opened a Public Hearing regarding the Vacation of a Portion of 5th Street at 6:02 p.m. This is the portion of 5th Street adjacent to property owned by Mrs. Parker. In the absence of public comments, the Mayor closed the Public Hearing at 6:03 p.m.

Visitor Guy McCausland spoke about the cornerstone laying ceremony that will be performed by the Camanche Masonic Lodge and the Grand Lodge. The ceremony will take place at noon on March 21, 2020. He recommended arriving 15 minutes early and invited everyone to attend.

Adopt a Resolution of Official Endorsement for Camanche Fire Department to Continue an Intergovernmental Transfer of Public Funds Transfer Agreement with the Iowa Department of Human Services; Receive, accept and place on file draft minutes from the Historical Board meeting held on February 12, 2020; Approve renewal of Class C Beer Permit with Sunday Sales as submitted by Camanche Marina, Inc. effective 05/01/2020. On roll call – all Ayes.

Moved by Varner, second by Weller to Adopt a Resolution Setting a Date and Time for a Public Hearing on the Proposed FYE 2021 Budget. On roll call – all Ayes.

Moved by Brightman, second by Schnoor to Adopt a Resolution Setting a Time and Place for a Public Hearing on a Proposal to Amend the FYE 2020 Budget for the City of Camanche. On roll call – all Ayes.

A discussion regarding the FEMA Grant for Swan Drive Properties was tabled and will be placed on a future agenda.

Chief Reid read the Camanche Police Department February report.

Mayor Willis congratulated Schnoor's daughter, the Camanche bowling teams and the Camanche Basketball team.

Varner said the Historical Society is cleaning up preparing for the kids to tour. He reported the Landfill is moving forward getting new cells built. Schnoor said there will be no school on Tuesday; the basketball team plays Monticello. He said they have the potential to win it all. He also said the kids are anxious to get started sandbagging. Alderman said it worked better at the practice field and he will talk to Hilgendorf. Schnoor's daughter is playing in the NCAA basketball tournament for Loras College. She is also going to travel with the Division III team to Brazil for 10 days. Weller said the Holiday House Committee has scheduled a St. Patrick's Day event on March 14th from 2:00 p.m. until 4:00 p.m.

Chief Schutte talked about the GEMT resolution on the consent agenda. We will receive the first invoice in March and the first payment in May. His CCDA grant application is done and ready to submit. The renovation project includes living space, vestibule, security cameras and key system and will be approximately \$53,000; the grant application is for \$40,000 and our portion is \$13,000. He is also helping Park and Recreation with their CCDA grant application. Reid talked about the updates to the Police Department lobby and said the blink camera is installed so officers on duty can communicate with people in the lobby.

Bob Edens asked if the three Swan Drive properties interested in the FEMA Grant buyout were adjacent to one another. Mayor Willis said they are not. Donna Current said the Wiebers family donated their vegetable stand and it will hopefully be moved to the Historical Building.

Mayor Willis adjourned the meeting at 6:24 p.m.
