## City of Camanche June 18, 2024

The City Council of the City of Camanche, Iowa met in regular session June 18, 2024, at 6:00 p.m. at Camanche City Hall. Moved by Councilman Farrell, second by Councilman Edens to Suspend the Rules of Procedure. On roll call – all Ayes.

Moved by Councilman Farrell, second by Councilman Weller to allow for the reading of a Resolution by Title Only. On roll call – all Ayes.

Mayor Pruett read a Resolution authorizing and approving a Loan Agreement, providing for the issuance of a \$500,000 General Obligation Water Improvement Note, Series 2024 and providing for the levy of taxes to pay the same, by title only.

Moved by Councilman Farrell, second by Councilman Weller to Adopt a Resolution authorizing and approving a Loan Agreement, providing for the issuance of a \$500,000 General Obligation Water Improvement Note, Series 2024 and providing for the levy of taxes to pay the same. On roll call – all Ayes.

City Administrator Kida led a discussion regarding the Water Meter Debt Repayment. He explained that we can repay this debt with an additional meter charge or a debt service fee. It is up to Council where we get the money to repay the debt. Kida estimates the additional monthly cost for each bill will be approximately \$1.40-\$1.70 per month. He asked Council if they want a meter charge, a debt service fee or a hybrid. Councilman Klahn would like to see how much before he makes a decision. Councilman Edens said he likes a hybrid approach. Councilman Weller said we could start with the hybrid, but if we have to change it, we could change it. Kida will come up with a hybrid model for the next meeting.

Moved by Councilman Edens, second by Councilman Weller to Adopt a Resolution directing the transfer of Proprietary Utility Funds from the Water Fund \$25,000 to the Solid Waste Fund. On roll call – all Ayes.

Moved by Councilman Weller, second by Councilman Klahn to Adopt a Resolution Directing the Transfer of Funds from Special Revenue to Federal Funds for the purpose of Expending for Employee Benefits. On roll call – all Ayes.

Moved by Councilman Weller, second by Councilman Farrell to Adopt a Resolution Establishing the Level of Compensation for the Employees of the City of Camanche for FYE 2025. On roll call – all Ayes.

Moved by Councilman Klahn, second by Councilman Farrell to Approve an Amendment to the City Administrator Contract ending June 30, 2026. On roll call – all Ayes.

Public Works Director Pewe gave a Power Point presentation regarding Storm Water Catch Basin Repairs. He showed photos of multiple catch basins around town in need of repair or replacement. He said where there are cracks, he considered filling the cracks ourselves but there are just too many so he will get bids. Manatt's does it as well as a company in Bettendorf. Without a designated fund, we must use Road Use Funds to pay for these repairs. He said we just spent \$29,000 on 8<sup>th</sup> Street and asked how we should go about repairing and replacing the damaged catch basins. Councilman Edens thinks it is appropriate to use Road Use funds because the damage in some areas has far less to do with storm drains; he feels that construction traffic wore out the roads faster. He also said the repairs done on 23<sup>rd</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> were mainly because they were worn out by truck traffic. Pewe concluded by saying he just wanted to put it in front of Council; it is information for future use. Kida added that it could affect our Capital Improvement plan and our Street Improvement Plan. We have no way to raise Road Use Tax, we can only wait for our payments from the state.

City Attorney Current wanted to make sure all Councilmembers were aware of the City Ordinance regarding fireworks. It is only legal to use fireworks in the City of Camanche between 6:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m. on July 4<sup>th</sup> only. The fine for violation is a minimum of \$250. Kida said Gail Grim has accepted the Library Director position and will begin her duties on July 2<sup>nd</sup>. Mrs. Grim said she appreciates the opportunity and is looking forward to it. Mayor Pruett congratulated Mrs. Grimm. Councilman Weller welcomed Mrs. Grim. Pewe reported that the part time summer workers have started and are getting the mowing done. The retest on Well 7 went well. There is a tree issue behind Clyde's. Chief Schmitz said the concrete work at the police station is done.

Councilman Weller would like to have a discussion on Building Code violations and pointing out bad contractors on the next agenda. He would like to involve the City Attorney(s) and the Building Inspector.

Being no further business, Mayor Pruett adjourned the meeting at 7:06 pm.
